## VETERAN DINNER NOVEMBER 11TH

I manned the front door and only charged the \$15 to non-veterans. When the people entered the Native Daughters had a book for everyone to sign. In the book the guest put yes if they had been in the service and then which branch they served. I reviewed the book and may have missed some but I counted 26 veterans. I also found that 75 guests had signed the book. The breakdown was Army - 10, Air Force - 2, Navy - 10, Marine Corps - 4.

When I deposited the proceeds from the dinner it came out to 78 paid so we had over a 100 at the dinner. Before the dinner the scouts presented the flag and led in the pledge of allegiance. After this a neighbor in Greenhorn Creek, Andy Juknelis who is a 2 star general, walked around and talked to several of the veterans. While this was going on the Native Daughters were selling tickets for the gift baskets.

The dinner was started when the salad was put out and this salad allowed you to put one of three dressings on your salad. The dinner bell was rung and people lined up to get their spaghetti with meat sauce with rolls that were on the table. Everything was delicious. After dinner several of the veterans stood up and identified their branch and when they served. After this

we asked for the youngest veteran who turned out was only 33 and the then the oldest veteran who was 100. This of course brought a lot of applause. A delicious lemon cake desert was served after dinner. In the front of the dining room was a table with many, many bottles of wine which was donated by Ironstone. People could just walk up and pour their own wine of choice.

To wrap up the evening Eric Mackintosh walked around and had people pull the winning ticket for each of the donated items. I didn't get the names of the winners, except one and that was my wife Susan who won a magnum of wine from Four Winds and a Christmas dinner including a turkey. So thanks to the Native Daughters for donating these wonderful prizes. The evening was truly a tribute to our veterans.

OFFICIAL DUES NOTICE We are going to charge \$72 which is what we charged last year. As I have said before a large portion of our dues, almost \$50, goes to Grand Parlor as a per capita tax. The current roster contains 146 members so we will be able to retain \$3,200 to help offset a small portion of our annual expenses. In addition to the 146 members we have 17 Grand Officers, and 17 widows.

Since we started emailing the Nugget to most of the people in our roster we are saving about \$1,000 per year for all the paper, postage, postage fee, and printer cartridges. Last year we started asking for renewals by the newsletter and reminders to those who don't pay in a timely manner. We are currently down to mailing 24 Nuggets. This costs us about \$230 annually.

In the past we would send out reminders in January and February by mail which took a lot of time and money.
