BROTHERS YOUR \$72 PAYMENT FOR 2023 DUES SHOULD HAVE BEEN PAID BY NOW

As of Friday February 24th we have received 107 dues payments. Many of these payments came after Steve Ageno sent out dues letters to members who hadn't paid. If you haven't paid please send in your money as soon as possible.

It takes a lot of effort each year on the part of Steve and myself trying to get every one to pay. We have 146 members so we still need to hear from the 39 who haven't paid. Every month in the Nugget I ask for the dues to be paid and now with Steve's mailing everyone has been notified.

One thing that bothers me is the fact we even had to send out letters to remind people to pay. Those who have emails get this notice every month and those who hadn't paid got reminder letters. By the end of March all should have been paid.

Editors note: I am often asked how much we made on our member dinners and our socials. We had 2 very successful meals with the crab feed and the crab cioppino feed. One of the reasons I keep asking for larger crowds at our member dinner because if you look at the costs for the January and February member dinner we ended up with a small profit. We have to remember we pay for the food, electricity, heating, cleanup and other miscellaneous expenses.

An example is the cost per person for the cleanup is \$5.40 when you have 37 and \$5.77 when you have 53 people. Now for some good news about our bank account. I worked through the numbers for the crab feed and the crab cioppino feed and included taxes on the sales, the cleanup, and the food. The income of all these events includes the raffles and any donations. With all the costs included for the crab feed we ended up with a net profit \$1,700.

When everyone else, was charging \$60 and more at \$50 everyone who attended got a real bargain. Even more impressive was the crab cioppino feed where we charged \$60 when everyone was charging \$75 and more. The net profit for this was \$3,600. The bar had a net profit of about \$900. The two pancake breakfast had net profits of \$2,200. I didn't attempt to determine all the other expenses we have on a monthly basis such as electricity, phone costs, heating costs, water, sewage and garbage but with these first two months behind us we did well. If the March events are successful we should make it through the year with some money still in the bank.
