As the financial secretary you all know that I try to track where we are making money or in some cases losing money. With our great social turnouts and 49er days we added a lot to our bank account. Since those events we have not brought in enough to maintain the amount we gained in the first three month. The biggest cause of this loss is the low turnout for our member dinners. In addition with no April or May social many monthly utility and other bills keep coming in the bank account keeps shrinking.

Because some charges are partially for member dinners and partially for socials I can't allocate some of the expenses properly. I don't try to allocate the utilities cost to an event because there is no way to measure this. Another example is the white table cloths we put on the tables for member dinners and socials. Here is an attempt to show how the various events either end in profit or a loss.

At the end of March we had most of our income. Since then with no social in April and May we of course have to pay our average monthly expenses.

As you can see from the monthly charges it is important that we have large crowds for our member dinners, socials, and pancake breakfasts. When you pay \$200 to clean up most of member dinners and socials when we have only 40 people attend \$5 of the income of the \$20 goes for the cleanup. That means that all for the food and other things like table clothes we have \$15 for everything.

When you look at the raffle income, and other donation income a larger crowd adds to the total income for each meal. I hope you all will keep this in mind when you are deciding whether or not to attend.
